Public Speaking – Tomorrow at 12:00 pm selected students from each class will present their very challenging impromptu speech. When preparing for the impromptu speeches, each participant is assigned two helpers and 20 minutes to prepare. Teachers judge each speech, using set criteria, and the winners of each stage are announced at our Presentation Night. Last Tuesday, two representatives from each class presented their prepared speeches, which were all very entertaining and well prepared.

Years 3 and 4 Excursion to Borambola – Our excursion to Borambola is just two days away! A detailed note has been sent home today. I am sure they are all getting very excited!

Life Education – This Thursday, the Life Education Van will pay a visit to our Kindergarten to Year 2 students. The mission of Life Education is to "empower our children and young people to make safer and healthier choices through education". We hope that our students both enjoy and benefit from this visit. Shekere Beats – Next Monday, Jonas Tandoh of Shekere Beats will visit our school to perform various African rhythms produced by the Shekere. A Shekere is an African percussion instrument made from the dried fruit of the gourd vine and loosely covered with a wide decorative band of beads. We are really looking forward to seeing this performance. Please make sure that you return signed permission notes and money by this Friday.

National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) - Last week, I attended an NDIS meeting with the Department of Education (DoE) NDIS Coordinator and Intereach personnel. It was a great opportunity to learn more about the NDIS and the systems that need to be in place to support the provision of having externally funded service providers working in the school. Did you know that there are approximately 810,000 students in Department of Education schools? Approximately 100,000 of these students are listed on the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) for disability and it is estimated that about 50,000 of these students have (or are eligible to have) an NDIS plan. If your child has an NDIS plan and you would like an externally funded service provider to support your child at school, there is a process that needs to be followed. Step 1 involves the parents/carers providing a written request to the school. Step 2 involves the parents/carers having a meeting with the principal to discuss the need, intended impact, alignment with the child's Personalised Learning and Support Plan, requested delivery times and frequency, and why the child needs to access the service during school time. Decisions to allow external providers to provide support at the school are made on a case-by-case basis and are at the principal's discretion. Agreements are reviewed each year or as the school sees fit. A school's core business is curriculum delivery and looking after the learning and wellbeing of each child. Therefore, the impact of such provisions need to be considered in order to serve the best interests of the child and ensure the school is meeting its curriculum delivery responsibilities. Making sure there are no gaps in the child's learning is a priority. Step 3 if approved, the timing and frequency of external service delivery is to be negotiated with the principal. Less intrusive times, such as before school, during lunch, recess or Special Religious Education (SRE) are preferable. At Holbrook Public School, we want to remove the obstacles preventing any child from receiving the support they need, but in doing so, we need to consider our own responsibilities as a school as well.

Visitors to the School – It is a requirement of the Department of Education's Work Health and Safety directorate that all visitors and contractors to the school sign in/out on arrival and departure. This requirement is to ensure the safety of our students as well as our visitors, in case of an emergency evacuation or lock down.

YEARS 5 AND 6 BALLARAT EXCURSION




LIBRARY NEWS


